- ❑ SAT and ACT are national college admissions exams Some scholarships also require a certain SAT or ACT score, can replace FSA reading as well.
- ❑ SAT and ACT are given throughout the school year Registration done online. Juniors will take SAT at LBHS in March for FREE!

- ❑ ASVAB ~ sign up at LBHS for Career Aptitude (March)
- ❑ SAT subject tests (best time to take one is after completion of an AP course) are required for some Private/more competitive Universities

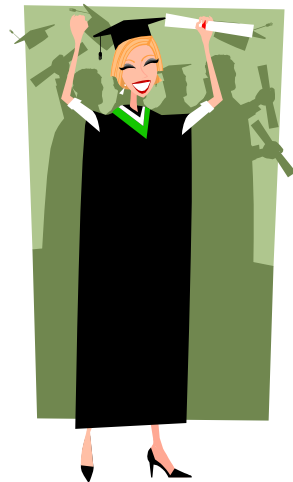
JUNIORS – Personal Goals

It's time to get serious about your plans after high school:

- ❑ Meet with military recruiters
- ❑ Look at vocational college options at Seminole State College, Valencia College and Orange Technical College
- ❑ Visit colleges and universities
- ❑ Prepare for SAT & ACT tests (1 free SAT will be given to you in the fall of your Senior year)
- ❑ Start preparing your resume (helps for letters of rec. and college admissions)
- ❑ Designate an E-mail address for college information and applications
- ❑ Plan on attending March 7, 2018 College Night @LBHS

Post Secondary plans

- Do your research (college, military, workforce)
- Plan for a senior year that will challenge your academic abilities
- Apply to your top choice colleges early (by October 31, 2018) – your transcripts can be ordered in Bldg. 1, 7 or 8 for a small fee



Senior Year: timeline

- ❑ Counselors meet with seniors early Q1 to review high school credits and graduation requirements
- ❑ Follow up meeting with counselor to discuss your individual plans: work, college or military
- ❑ Apply by October 31, 2018 to your top university choices
- ❑ Plan to retake SAT or ACT if needed
- ❑ Get familiar with scholarships using the College room at LBHS or on our school website
- ❑ Understand the financial aid process –application opens Oct 1 every year <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov>
- ❑ Promotion Policy-must have 19 credits to be classified as a Senior

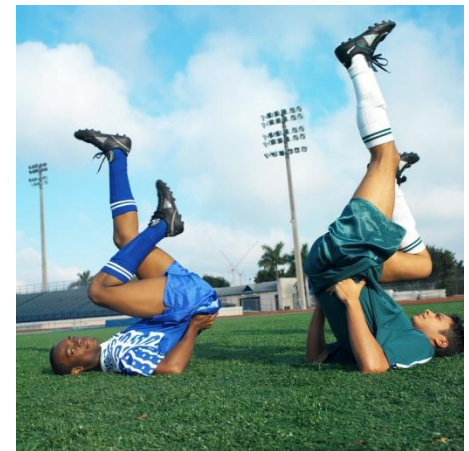
□ **About NCAA and NAIA**

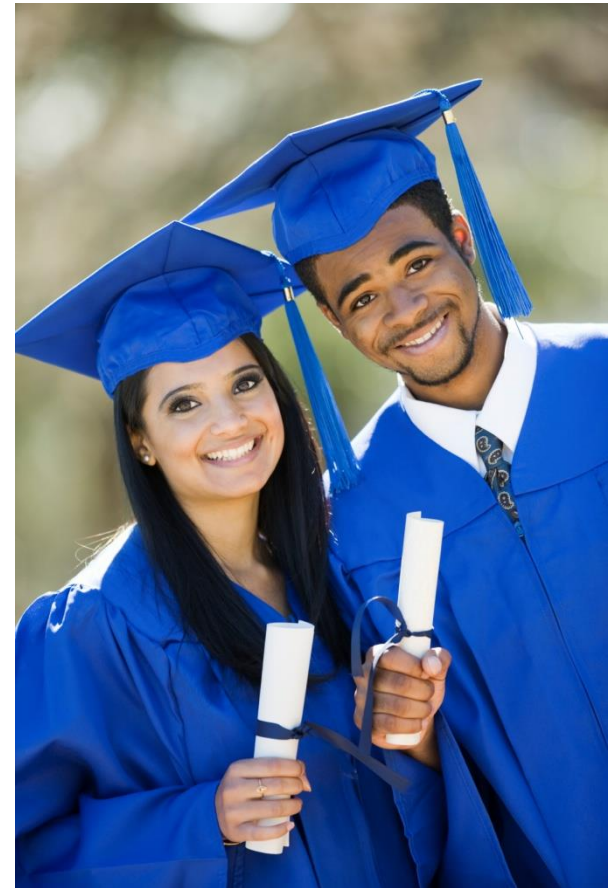
