Other things to keep in mind...

- In order to be promoted to the next grade level you need to have earned the following credits:
- 10th grade: **6** credits earned by the end of 9th grade
- 11th grade: **12** credits earned by the end of 10th grade
- 12th grade: **19** credits earned by the end of 11th grade

- Community service applications need to be turned into your counselor before you start your hours and after you have completed all hours with your log form. See district website for more information

- Summer School may be held at Lyman HS-more information to come

Seminole County Virtual School

- All students must complete an online course to meet graduation requirements
- Be sure to speak with your counselor about which course is the right one for you to take
- Apply for admission online: www.flvs.net
- Select SCVS as your district franchise from the drop down menu when registering
- After you have created your account and registered for your course, make sure you email your counselor for approval
- SCVS instructor will contact student/parent when course is assigned
- Contact your counselor when course is completed to verify it was entered on your transcript

SSC Dual Enrollment

- There are three different types of dual enrollment
 - Vocational
 - Career
 - Academic

Vocational Dual Enrollment

- Open to Juniors and Seniors
- Specialties include: Electrical, Fire Sprinkler Installation and Plumbing
- 2.0 Un-weighted GPA
- Test scores/TABE
- Must have own transportation

Career Dual Enrollment

Pharmacy Tech or Criminal Justice

- Open to Juniors and Seniors
- 2.5 Un-weighted GPA
- Test score: ACT/SAT/PERT
- Transportation provided

Business Management

- Seniors only
- 2.5 Un-weighted GPA
- Test score: ACT/SAT/PERT
- Transportation provided

Academic Dual Enrollment

- 3.0 Unweighted GPA
- College Ready test score: SAT/ACT/PERT
- Must have own transportation
- Limited to academic classes needed for graduation (some exceptions may apply)
- Subject to principal approval

ACT and SAT

- These are college entrance exams given multiple times a year. Students with free/reduce lunch status can receive 2 fee waivers for each exam.
- The ACT & SAT exams can also be used to meet the FSA Reading requirement by earning a specific concordant score.
- We recommend students take these exams during the Spring semester of their Junior year.
- *SCPS School day SAT for Juniors will be on **March 1, 2017**

Choosing the right course

- Make sure you select courses that follow what you will need to take according to what is required for graduation.
- If you are making an A or a B in a course this year, consider taking a higher level course next year. For example an honors or Advanced Placement course.
- If you are not doing well in your current class this year, **do not** select a higher level course. This will ensure that you give yourself the opportunity to bring up your GPA.

Registration Cards

- Make sure you have your registration card with your name and information on it
- Take a look on the back of the registration card to view your credit history. Use this to guide you in making sure you have the credits you need to graduate
- If you have a passing grade for a course but no credit earned, see your counselor at a later time
- Complete this card to select the courses that you would like to have for next school year
- Use the curriculum guide to look up the course code number for each of your courses and the course description

Registration Cards cont'd

- Write in the **course number** for the course you wish to take
- Clearly write the **name** of the course
- Write in the **credit value** for each course-Ex: 1 credit or .5 credit for semester classes. Remember you must have a total of 7 credits on the form
- Have your **teacher initial** in the box for each core class you plan to take
- Please give at least **3 alternate elective** choices in the event that your first choices are not available
- Parent signature **IS REQUIRED!**
- Turn form back to your English teacher (freshman) or your World History/American History teacher (10th/11th) no later than **FEBRUARY 10th!**

Early Release/Late Arrival (Partial Schedules)

- Students wanting to have early release or late arrival need to complete the contract. Students must meet the criteria listed on the contract in order to be approved for early release/late arrival
- Students must let their counselor know which courses they do not wish to take and which periods they want to have no course scheduled
- Contracts need to be turned in to your counselor by **March 1st** to ensure that schedules can be changed since there will be no changes over the summer
